Description:

Abstract:

This is a digital database of selected census characteristics arranged by Chicago Community Areas. Chicago Community Areas are areas within the City of Chicago that are commonly used for statistical purposes. In most cases, they are composed of groups of census tracts that are consecutively numbered. Census data describing social, economic, and housing information were taken directly from various summary tape files and a printout from the City of Chicago's Department of Planning. Because Chicago Community Areas are not a Census Bureau tabulation geography, the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission's Research Services Department aggregated whole tracts to Chicago Community Area boundaries. Because some census tract boundaries within Chicago were changed between 1980 and 1990, there may be some slight changes in Community Area boundaries that are not reflected here. Also, all median values in the database were calculated by the Research Services Department.

Purpose:

This file was created to support NIPC's long-range forecasting and modeling activities and to provide a functional data set which the public can use to obtain census information for Chicago Community Areas. This data set is developed for use with NIPC's Chicago Community Areas boundaries coverage.

Supplemental_Information:

The database includes information from the 1980 and 1990 censuses. See the Source Information section in this metadata for more information.

Originally there were 75 community areas delineated for the 1930 Census. Since then there have been two additions. O'Hare (#76) was added for the 1960 Census due to all the annexation around the airport in the 1950's; and Edgewater (#77) was delineated for the 1980 Census by splitting off the northern part of Uptown (#3) at Foster Avenue.

In general the relationships between community area numbers and tract numbers is thus: the first two digits of a 4-digit tract number correspond to the community area number. (Note: Three-digit tract numbers must be preceded with a leading zero.) From these data sets, a SAS program was written to extract and aggregate tract information to reflect the boundaries of Chicago Community Areas. Chicago Community Areas are areas within the City of Chicago that are commonly used for statistical purposes. In most cases, they are composed of groups of census tracts that are consecutively numbered. In general the relationships between community area numbers and tract numbers is thus: the first two digits of a 4-digit tract number correspond to the community area number. (Note: Three-digit tract numbers must be preceded with a leading zero.)

Because Chicago Community Areas are not a Census Bureau tabulation geography, the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission's Research Services Department aggregated whole tracts to Chicago Community Area boundaries. Because some census tract boundaries within Chicago were changed between 1980 and 1990, there may be some slight changes in Community Area boundaries that are not reflected here. The SAS program included calculations for all median values: median age, median rent, median home value, median household income for both 1979 and 1989 and median family income for both 1979 and 1989. Chicago Community Area data then were imported into a spreadsheet program. The file was saved as a .DBF file in Excel.

hence, only one income), median household income is usually less than median family income. Because the Chicago Community Areas are not a Census Bureau tabulation geography, median incomes for Chicago Community Areas are calculated totals.

Technical Documentation: Data contained in STF 3A are estimates, based on census questionnaires distributed to only a sample of the housing units in any specific area. These questionnaires contained 45 more questions than the basic "short form" 14 question survey distributed to all housing units. The "long form" questionnaire, tabulated on STF 3A, was mailed out, on average, to one of every six housing units. In governmental jurisdictions with an estimated population of fewer than 2,500 people in 1988, one out of every two housing units was sampled. Except in the most populated census tracts where the rate was one in eight, the sampling rate in other jurisdictions was one in six. Data in STF 3A are the Census Bureau's estimates of the actual figures that would have resulted if the questionnaire had been distributed to all housing units.

Because the data are based on a sample they are subject to sampling error (i.e., the difference between actual values and the values derived from a sample). Based on a one in six sample, the following guidelines could be used to assess the impact of sampling error:

There is about a 5 percent probability that an estimated value of 10,000 persons or households with a particular characteristic shown in a table in this data bulletin actually represents a value of less than 9,560 or more than 10,440. The interval becomes proportionately wider as the estimated value drops. The comparable confidence interval for an estimated value of 1,000 is 860 to 1,140. For a value of 100, the interval is 56 to 144. For all practical purposes, an estimated value of less than 100 should be considered only a very approximate indication of the actual number. Zero does not indicate that there are no people with a particular characteristic, but merely that none showed up in the sample

be used by federal agencies for statistical purposes.

At the core of this definition was the 1961 economy food plan, the least costly of four nutritionally adequate food plans designed by the Department of Agriculture. It was determined from the Agriculture Department's 1955 survey of food consumption that families of three or more persons

spend approximately one-third of their income on food; hence, the poverty level for these families was set at three times the cost of the economy food plan. For smaller families and persons living alone, the cost of the economy food plan was multiplied by factors that were slightly higher to compensate for the relatively larger fixed expenses for these smaller households.

In 1989 the average poverty threshold for a family of four persons was \$12,674. Poverty thresholds vary based on number of individuals in the household, number of related children under 18 years of age in the household, and whether or not the householder is 65 and older. Households are classified as being below the poverty level when the total 1989 income of the family or of the nonfamily householder is lower than the appropriate poverty threshold. The thresholds ranged from \$5,947 for a 65 year old living alone to \$27,596 for a nine person household with only one child.

Poverty thresholds are applied on a national basis and do not account for local variations in the cost of living. The actual poverty thresholds are updated annually to allow for changes in the cost of living as measured by the Consumer Price Index. Appendix A, which can be found in the file called POVSCALE.PDF, presents poverty thresholds in 1989 by size of family and number of related children under 18 years.

Poverty status and eventually poverty rates are determined by the census for all persons except institutionalized persons, persons in college dormitories or military group quarters, and unrelated individuals under 15 years old. These exclusions mean that the population for whom poverty status is determined does not usually equal the total population. As a result, the universe for determining poverty rates is the population for whom poverty status has been determined rather than the total population.
